Medications for Addictions Treatment E-Learning Course

Overview

The overall purpose of this course is to enhance your professional knowledge of Medications for Addictions Treatment (MAT), and build skills related to engaging and educating patients about MAT.

- 4. Relate information to enable providers to become more skilled at outreach and engagement of specific racial and ethnic minority populations in MAT.
