# **Description:**

This Virtual Coffee Break introduces providers to the updated 2024 Quality Family Planning recommendations on family building and basic infertility services. Participants will explore person-centered approaches to supporting diverse family-building pathways, strategies to enable healthy pregnancies, and guidance on offering basic fertility services with appropriate referrals. Through practical examples, case studies, and interactive knowledge checks, the course equips providers to affirm patients' reproductive goals with compassion, respect, and evidence-based care.

#### **Outcome:**

Participants will self-report increased confidence in providing person-centered sexual and reproductive health care that supports varied family-building pathways, promotes healthy pregnancy, and includes appropriate basic infertility services and referrals

- Provide person-centered care to support all family-building pathways with compassion and respect.
- Support healthy pregnancy and fertility by offering education, screenings, and pre-pregnancy care.
- Offer basic fertility services and ensure timely referrals for advanced reproductive treatments when needed.
- Affirm patients' reproductive goals through comprehensive education, counseling, and emotional support.
